

BIO – BENJAMIN WARF

Dr. Benjamin Warf is Professor of Neurosurgery at Harvard Medical School and holds the Hydrocephalus and Spina Bifida Chair at Boston Children's Hospital, where he is Director of Neonatal and Congenital Anomaly Neurosurgery. He was the founding Medical Director of the CURE Children's Hospital of Uganda from 2000 through 2006, where he developed the ETV/CPC technique for treating infant hydrocephalus. He currently serves as senior Medical Director of CURE Hydrocephalus, a specialty program within CURE International that trains and equips neurosurgeons from developing countries to perform ETV/CPC. He also serves on the Board of Directors for CURE International. He was named a MacArthur Fellow in 2012 and used the award to establish the Global Hydrocephalus and Spina Bifida fund at Boston Children's Hospital. He has partnered with IF since 2000, serving as its neurosurgery advisor, and currently serves on the IF Global Experts Panel.
